2. RLA works to monitor our lake's water quality and undertake projects to reduce the amount of sediment and phosphorus directly entering Rice Lake.
3. RLA actively applies for grant monies to support our work on both AIS and water quality but matching funds are often required. Grants in 2022 that we received paid for the AIS management.
4. RLA represents you and your interests with government agencies – North Fork Crow River Watershed District (NFCRWD), Stearns County, Eden Valley, Eden Lake Township, Paynesville Township, MPCA, DNR, Environment Services and others.
